Ivana Armanini is a Zagreb-based comic artist with works archived in Museum, art and Library collections. Her comics have been exhibited and published in 15+ countries, from Portland to Melbourne.

Her work explores themes of resistance, feminism, and queer narratives through experimental comics and multimedia collaborations. Merging graphic storytelling with social activism through autobiographical narratives and collective cultural actions. As a founder of the alternative comics platform KOMIKAZE (2002–present) she works on the independent scene with more then 200 NGO organizations and initiatives. She is recognized by the Angoulême Alternative Comics Award (2020) for editorial innovation. With over 25+ years of practice, her comics and projects—including FEMICOMIX, Permacomix, and Zombi Proleter—bridge underground comics, social critique, and DIY culture.

## KEY HIGHLIGHTS:

**International Recognition:** The Alternative Comics Award 2020 at the Angoulême Comic Festival (France) stands out as a major international achievement, recognising the editorial research and experimentation of Komikaze. The jury specifically noted the consistent annual publication and the discovery of emerging artists, particularly from Eastern Europe.

**Long-Standing Career:** With public art appearances dating back to 1993, Ivana Armanini has maintained a consistent and evolving presence in the art world for over three decades.

**Diverse Artistic Practice:** Beyond her editorial work, Armanini is recognised as an artist with a distinctive style, evolving from "punky agitated drawing" to a "smooth, meditative, almost abstract approach." Her work includes comics, posters, murals, and project design.

**Extensive Network:** The numerous collaborations, reviews, and interviews across various platforms (print, radio, online) in Croatia, Slovenia, France, Italy, Germany, USA, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Austria, Hungary and Portugal demonstrate a wide international network and reach.

**Komikaze:** Founded in 2002, Komikaze is highlighted as an "essential platform for emerging talent from Croatia and the wider region," featuring diverse and challenging work. Armanini's role as the long-serving editor is consistently acknowledged. **Engagement with Social Issues:** Recent mentions like the Exhibition dedicated to killed journalists in Gaza and benefit exhibitions for Gaza highlight an engagement with contemporary social and political issues.

**Focus on Femicomix:** The recurring mention of "Femicomix" indicates a significant interest and contribution to feminist comics, including tours and exhibitions dedicated to the topic.

**Curatorial and organisational roles:** Involvement as a selector for the "Biennale of European and Mediterranean Youth" in 2007 and 2009 demonstrates the influence and engagement within the broader art scene."
